The Rubidoux site funding is for repair and renovations of two modulars, outdoor playground equipment, playground surfacing, shade and fencing, and educational supplies and equipment for 2 classrooms. The PAT Community Outreach Workers and the classroom teacher will each make monthly home visits to 25 families per year, with referrals and follow-up services provided as necessary. PESD will also provide a Parent and Child program for 60 parents and their two-year-old children. The program strengthens the bond between parent and child, honoring the fact that a parent is a child's first and best teacher.
